HQDA is soliciting applications for the following courses.

SENIOR LEADER SEMINAR (SLS) COURSE - is a one-week seminar that will enhance the education of select Department of the Army Civilians (GS-15 or equivalent) who are either currently assigned to, or projected for assignment to, key positions as advisors and staff officers for general officers and senior civilian leaders. SLS will provide selectees an experience that is both broadening and educational, focused on increasing senior personnel in preparation for service at the National level.

TRADOC suspense - Monday, 05 March 2012 (class dates - 05-10 August 2012)

ARMY CONGRESSIONAL FELLOWSHIP PROGRAM - The target audience for the Army Congressional fellowship program is eligible Army Civilians GS-11 through

GS-14 or equivalent levels. This 18-month program is designed to provide congressional training to top army officers and Civilians. Civilian nominees should be identified by their organization as being on track for executive level service. The selected Fellow will begin his/her fellowship in May FY13 by participating in a HQDA orientation for six months. This orientation is aimed at educating the Fellow on how HQDA and other DOD agencies operate. The academic portion of the Fellowship begins simultaneously with the orientation and intensive summer program of study at George Washington University (GWU). GWU's Masters' in Legislative Affairs program is a rigorous eleven-course, one-of-a-kind in the nation, curriculum that exposes students to all aspects of the congressional experience.

Tuition for the ACFP (\$25,000) is centrally funded; however, commands are responsible for all associated travel, per diem, and any other authorized expenses.
