


MR. GREGG STEVENS, SENIOR EXECUTIVE SERVICE CHIEF, AMEDD CIVILIAN CORPS



Mr. Gregg Stevens became the AMEDD Civilian Corps Chief on 12 November 2009. He also is the Deputy to the Commanding General, Army Medical Department Center and School, Fort Sam Houston, Texas. From December 2005 until assuming that position, he served as the Assistant Chief of Staff for the Center and School. Prior to that, he served for three years as the Deputy Chief, Leader Training Center and the Program Director for the Army Medical Department Executive Skills Program.

In addition to his years of service as an AMEDD civilian, Mr. Stevens served nearly 30 years on active duty, receiving his commission as a Regular Medical Service Corps Army officer through the Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) upon graduation from Providence College in 1968. He holds a Masters Degree in Health Care Administration from the U.S. Army Baylor Program. His military schooling includes

the Army Medical Department Officer Basic and Advanced Courses, the Medical Logistics Officer Course, the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College, and the U.S. Army War College.

Mr. Stevens' active duty assignments included commands at the U.S. Army Health Care Systems Support Activity, Fort Sam Houston; 68th Medical Group, Germany; Joint Task Force Provide Promise (Forward), Croatia; and the 5th Mobile Army Surgical Hospital, Fort Bragg. His other assignments include Chief of Staff, U.S. Army MEDCOM, Fort Sam Houston; Executive Officer, Office of the Surgeon General; Deputy Chief of Staff, Health Services Command, Fort Sam Houston; Deputy Commander for Administration, USAMEDDAC, West Point; Assistant Inspector General, 7th Medical Command, Germany; Chief, Logistics Division, Fort Leavenworth; Chief, Liaison and Customer Assistance Branch, U.S. Army Medical Materiel Agency, Fort Detrick; Company Commander, U.S. Army Medical Department Activity-Japan, Okinawa; Chief, Service Branch, Logistics Division, U.S. Army Hospital, Okinawa; Chief, Materiel Branch, Logistics Division, U.S. Army Hospital, Fort Carson; Assistant S-4, 67th Medical Group, Da Nang, Viet Nam; S-4, 307th Medical Battalion and Division Medical Supply Officer, 82nd Airborne Division, Fort Bragg.
