15 Jul 14—First of three deadlines for applications to the Harvard Senior Executive Fellows (SEF) program. This first submission is for class dates 12 Oct – 7 Nov 2014. The 4-week course is held at the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University, Cambridge, MA and is targeted for GS14/15 or equivalent levels. Eligibility is limited to permanent employees with 3 years in a civilian position. The course is designed to build executive skills in political and public management, negotiation, human resources management, policy-making, organizational, strategy, communication, ethics, and leadership. It is primarily focused on the skills required of upper-level managers who are required to focus on "the larger picture" of the organization. If you are interested, be sure you are current on your CES coursework and that this course is included in your IDP! There are a second class and third class with MEDCOM deadlines for nomination packages. ### EDUCATION & TRAINING - MOBILE EDUCATION TEAMS (METS)

In FY13/FY14, the Army Management Staff College (AMSC) had to decrease capacity due to furlough, shutdown, and low faculty fill, which left hundreds of Army civilians on wait list/backlog for Civilian Education System (CES) courses, particularly the Advanced Course. HQDA G-37/TRV is assisting AMSC with an interim plan to fund Mobile Education Teams (METs) for the CES Advanced Course to support organizations in the National Capital Region (NCR), as well as several other locations with a high density of Army Civilians. The plan includes funding for curriculum development specialists directed by the Army Civilian Workforce Transformation (CWT) that I've talk about for the last couple of years. Stay tuned for an opportunity in your area! We'll publish more info as soon as we get it.

## **MEDCOM WORKFORCE 2020**

As part of the Workforce 2020 initiative and a desire to make MEDCOM civilian job vacancies more visible to MEDCOM employees, MEDCOM Civilian HR worked with the Office of Personnel Management (OPM) to create a web link to USAJobs that is pre-filtered search to reflect only MEDCOM civilian vacancy announcements. The campaign focus in 1st and 2nd Quarters has been TRUST. For 3rd and 4th Quarters the focus is HONORABLE SERVICE & STEWARDSHIP. The Civilian Corps is one component of the Army Profession, along with the Profession of Arms. What can we do in our workplaces and in performing our jobs to demonstrate these essential characteristics? What can we – each of us – do to promote trust, honorable service, and stewardship?
