FY 2023 Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey (FEVS) – 15 May to 30 Jun 2023

The Office of Personnel Management (OPM) has opened the window for the 2023 Federal Employee Viewpoint Survey (FEVS). The FEVS, which launched last week and closes on 30 June is an annual government-wide, non-attributional survey that offers a great way for Army Civilians to share their perspectives in many critical areas and this data is then used to feed into the annual Best Places to Work rankings. The more people who take the survey, the better idea we have of the concerns and needs of the civilian population. Eligible employees should check their inbox to access the 2023 FEVS. The FEVS takes just 20 minutes to complete, and its results contain critical information for the Army's most senior leaders.

AMEDD Aspiring Leader Development Program COHORT 23-24 - OPEN to GS 04-10, or equivalent (S: NLT COB 26 JUNE 2023)

The Aspiring Leader Development Program (ALDP) is a leader development program that begins with a nomination/application and competitive selection process to identify outstanding AMEDD Civilians who have consistently demonstrated the core Army values in the execution of their duties and who demonstrate skills, attributes, and potential required to become future leaders.

Who Should Apply: AMEDD Civilian employees in grades GS 04 - GS 10 or equivalent in permanent positions; have completed a probationary period and who aspire to develop the competencies necessary to assume greater responsibilities and advance in their careers. The ALDP is a one year program designed to develop participants in the DoD Civilian Leader Competencies. The ALDP provides the AMEDD with a pool of employees with enhanced competitiveness for future roles, and builds a stronger bench of aspiring leaders with potential for assignments of greater responsibility.

Joint Medical Executive Skills Institute Intermediate Executive Skills Course (JMESI-IESC), Suspense: 14 July 2023 (GS 11 and Above, or Equiv)

The AMEDD Civilian Corps is pleased to announce the call for applications for the Joint Medical Executive Skills Institute, Intermediate Executive Skills Courses (JMESI-IES) scheduled virtually for 16-19 October 2023.

This announcement applies to AMEDD Civilians assigned to MEDCOM, MEDCoE and other Army Medicine entities.

Eligibility: AMEDD Civilians in mid to senior level management positions (GS 11 and above, or equivalent) who desire to develop and enhance their healthcare management capabilities. The JMESI-IES Course provides education and training on leadership and management skills necessary to successfully serve in an intermediate-level leadership position within a DHA medical treatment facility (MTF). The course is designed to facilitate attainment of selected Joint Medical Executive Skills core competencies as identified by a Tri-Service review board of MHS senior leaders. This course will be held three times per year using a blended two-phase format.

Phase One: Students must complete 14 web-based training modules prior to phase two.

Phase Two: Students attend 4-day virtual course.
