### THINGS TO LOOK FOR:

- An announcement will be out soon for the CJ Reddy Leadership Course scheduled for 3-7 Apr 17. Attendance will be centrally funded and selection will be competitive so get ready if interested.
- MEDCOM's G-1 Civilian Human Resource Division newsletter is up on our AMEDD Civilian Corps website (https://ameddciviliancorps.amedd.army.mil) under the "What's New" and "Announcements" links. It has some good info for you.
- Civilian Acculturation Program: ASA M&RA signed memo to implement the program Army wide. OPORD currently in draft and should be out soon so keep an eye out for it.
- You will soon see a product of our most recent Strategic Learning Project, AMEDD LEADERS TAKING CARE OF PEOPLE: A HANDBOOK FOR SUPERVISORS OF CIVILIANS "Nothing but the FAQ's!" It is a handbook that addresses the most frequently asked questions about leading and managing civilian employees. It is in staffing and final edit now and will be out soon. BAYLOR HEALTHCARE ADMINISTRATION (HCA) MASTERS DEGREE PROGRAM: We just recently received the approval letter from the DA Manpower and Reserve Affairs Office giving permission to start again sending civilians to the Army Baylor HCA program. Headquarters MEDCOM is currently evaluating and staffing an announcement to see if it is possible to execute the coordination necessary to start sending

civilians in the summer of 2017. Keep an eye out for an announcement. If it does come out for this summer's class, the application timeframe will likely be VERY short, likely 6 weeks or less, so start thinking now about an application if you are interested. Current GRE scores will certainly be a requirement. Other application information should be available in the announcement. We anticipate that the opportunity will continue in future years as well. Just a heads up. We'll keep you posted as the situation develops.

#### **OVERSEAS OPPORTUNITIES**

On a recent trip to Korea, I found out that the command over there is looking for some special folks to work in the new facility at Camp Humphreys.
