We get a lot of questions about the Defense Performance Management and Appraisal Program (DPMAP), the new civilian appraisal system that's coming to MEDCOM this year. There is good Information posted on the Civilian Corps Website under (Yep, back to it again..) "What's New" on our website at (https://ameddciviliancorps.amedd.army.mil). MEDCOM is scheduled to transition to DPMAP in April 2017 (West Point only) and November 2017 (All other MEDCOM organizations). MEDCOM trainers are now ready to train other trainers in their units and conduct employee-supervisor training throughout the implementation of DPMAP. All employees and supervisors are required to

receive face-to-face training before transitioning to DPMAP. MEDCOM will use the Civilian Human Resources Training Application System (CHRTAS) to track attendee registration, attendance, graduation, and training records update.
